About CBWPA

Colorado Black Women for Political Action (CBWPA) is a non-partisan, non-profit organization impacting the community since 1977. Our main purpose is to provide a vehicle for meaningful political involvement of African Americans, create awareness around issues impacting our community, and to engage African American women living in Colorado in the political process.

Our History

In 1977, CBWPA, the brain-child of former State Senator Gloria Tanner, was founded by 13 women who wanted to encourage African-American participation in the political process and serve as a political advocate for the African-American community. Today, the organization's steadfast commitment to the vision of its founders is evident through its programs and services. Its members seek, daily, to infuse Colorado politics with the strength and perspective of the Black woman.

Our Values

- We believe in the advocacy of women's rights on the basis of the equality of the genders, economically, politically, et al.
- We respect differing opinions while holding steadfast to the knowledge that racism still exists and our communities are adversely affected by it.
- We believe that we have an obligation to treat all members and guests with respect.
- We treat the money entrusted to us as sacred.

Our Work

In our 41st year, we expanded programming to engage women of all ages, from all backgrounds, and with varying levels of experience with the political process.

- Lunch and learn sessions: an opportunity for social interaction among our members and the community
 as well as a casual, informal atmosphere where we can openly discuss topics and issues that impact our
 community within our ever-evolving Democracy.
- Talking politics after hours: a social setting where everyone is welcome (even non-members) to discuss local and national hot topics. No need to be an expert on politics.
- Reformatted general meeting beginning with Politics 101 basics for the first 15 minutes.
- Campaign Bootcamp to build a bench of campaign operatives of color
- Youth Initiative that includes training in how to run for student council
- Actively identified and endorsed key candidates and support their run for office.

Each year for the last 41 years, Colorado Black Women for Political Action has come together to break bread and celebrate leaders in our community. - **Promoting Black-owned businesses and facilitate 'buying Black'** through a Marketplace during our Dessert Reception after the luncheon.

L. Joy Williams

L. Joy is a trusted strategic adviser to elected leaders and organizations across the country and is sought after by various media outlets for her expertise in politics, civic engagement, and social justice.

She is the Founder and Principal of New York-based consulting firm LJW Strategies, President of the <u>Brooklyn NAACP</u>, Creator, Host and Producer of the civic education podcast <u>#SundayCivics</u> and chair of the Higher Heights for America Political Action Committee, where she leads efforts to engage Black women in supporting the organization's

endorsed candidates. She is also a founding member of Higher Heights for America.

In 2013, Williams worked to help successfully elect Letitia "Tish" James to the office New York City Public Advocate, and in 2014 she managed a midterm election campaign to turn out Black women voters for the Georgia and Ohio elections, increasing their participation by 10 percent.
